Tom's Tid-bits



Back in April, Tom talked about styling pines and demo'd a beautiful Japanese Larch. Below is a bit more detailed information on his techniques.

"One of the important points for all conifers is that the lower branches should angle downward at an acute angle, right at the trunk. This will help give the tree an appearance of more advanced age. The Japanese Larch pictured above, would be a good example. It is a tree I have grown from a seedling that is about 20 years old. The branch angles on the lower branches needed to be lowered, but they were too thick to do with wire alone. So I made a single saw cut through the bottom of the branch right were it comes out of the trunk, about 1/3rd of the way through. I lowered several of the bottom branches this way and held them in place with guy wires only. I covered the saw cut location with cut paste." -Tom
